2024 AGM Voting Results and Membership Feedback v2s

Wargrave Tennis Club AGM 2024

Our 2024 AGM was run as a 3-week process from 7th-28th November, with 144 members reviewing AGM documents and voting online via a survey (with 5 email reminders). Of those voting, 125 were adult members (60% of total adult membership and above our threshold of 30% for AGM votes to be valid). Overall participation was up 22% versus the 117 members who voted in the 2023 AGM online survey. In addition, a total of 11 members attended an AGM members meeting that was held on the 28th November. Overall, we feel that this online approach encourages much greater participation versus the 20-30 members who used to attend AGMs prior to online voting options.

The aim of the survey was to maximise membership participation in how the Club is run, by encouraging more members to vote on motions and proposals in line with the Club's objective: "Advance the game of tennis in Wargrave and the surrounding area; by encouraging and supporting more players, of all ages and abilities, to play better competitive or social tennis; in an environment that is fun, safe and inclusive."

AGM Reports

The online AGM was supported by the publication of the AGM Committee and Treasurers Reports. This were published online on the 7th November with hard copies available in the clubhouse. Links to the online reports were sent to all members via 5 emails.



Members are encouraged to vote on important motions and provide feedback to the committee via the online AGM survey that will run from Thursday 7th November until 8pm on the 28th November. Alternatively, members can provide their feedback at an AGM members meeting that will be held at 7.30pm on the 28th November in the crickte club (please arrive from 7pm so we can start on time).

Objectives and Goals

Our work as a committee is guided by the objectives and goals shown below. These were originally agreed in July 2022 and are linked to the aims and objectives set out in the Club's constitution.

"To advance the game of tennis in Wargrave and the surrounding area; by encouraging and supporting more players, of all ages and abilities, to play better competitive or social tennis; in an environment that is fun, safe and inclusive." Along with these objectives, we have three main goals:

1) Grow membership to 400+ over the next 2-3 years (Adults to 250+ / Juniors to 150+) in line with potential of our facilities and catchment area.

2) Keep our membership happy, with satisfaction levels at +80% measured via the AGM annual survey.

3) Manage Club finances over a 30+ year cycle to ensure we have adequate funds to maintain and improve our facilities, while holding reserves to always match 1 year of routine expenditure.












Membership Satisfaction Scores

Improvement Ideas

- 1. More artificial clay. Do not like the old-style hard courts!
- Perhaps move to anonymous surveys would allow respondents to provide more genuine feedback - thus giving committee members more accurate overall results on how their members are <u>thinking</u>?
- 3. A club house with a social space and bar for parents would be great
- 4. More coaching options. Still missing GDT I'm afraid.
- 5. To run the Club more as a social enterprise rather than a profit seeking business.
- Need to solve the conundrum of keeping the end courts (8,5 and 6) clear of debris. Access from the overflow car park could be improved. Regular socials (although Wednesday post practice beer is a great step forward). Video analysis!


Coaching Improvement Ideas






Feedback to artificial clay courts (based on responses from 137 members)

Comments and Other Ideas

- 1. Thank you committee for all your work!
- 2. I find it somewhat disturbing that despite being assured by the chairman that there would be no increase on annual subs you are discussing an increase.
- 3. I would prefer to see a Padel court at the club over more clay courts. <u>Also</u> a tiered membership for tennis, Padel and Rackets so people can choose what they're paying for.
- 4. Additional clay courts are a marginal benefit in my view and funds should be directed towards padel
- 5. The artificial clay courts are OK...but the ball bounce is poor even with brand new quality balls. I am opposed to increasing the clay court provision and would recommend deferring any intention to increase that provision until further research has been done on alternative types of artificial clay that may be available.
- 6. Both more artificial clay and padel are a great idea. The artificial clay is much better to play on than I had anticipated and is much safer and more enjoyable in damp weather. I am a convert! It would be a shame to lose our best hard courts 3,4 & 7 for the clay / padel. It would be preferable (although I don't have a solution) to improve 5,6 and 8 and bring them up to make the facilities truly first class. I appreciate there are some difficulties with this due to debris on the courts. Would covering the netting with screening / some sort of surround at the back help? Or introducing skirting board to keep leaves / twigs out. I realise this wouldn't entirely resolve the problem (because much blows over the top of the surrounds) but it might help. These three courts are undoubtedly the least popular to play on and most difficult to maintain. Introducing a padel court may also increase court congestion at peak times. Is there any possibility of using the space behind the clubhouse in the overflow car park? I suspect not because it's not our land!
- 7. It has not been made clear whether a new Padel court would mean losing one of the existing tennis <u>courts</u>. If so, I'm against it.
- 8. Whilst I think further clay courts are a good idea, my concern is that there won't be any decent playable safe hard courts left if courtd 3 & 4 are used for the clay courts. Please could we not invest in any more permanent markings for pickleball as its not really viable to use court 8 for tennis anymore. Thanks for all hard work and improvements to club :-)
- 9. I am happy to play on clay. But I don't prefer it. The bounce is low and the games are slower. It clearly suits <u>slice</u> and the slowness causes points to go on and on. We also need to manage the maintenance of our hard courts better. They need leaf and debris removal off court not just blown into the corner. Crucially they need treating to stop slippiness. Our courts are far more <u>slippy</u> than Shiplake hard courts. I don't know why. <u>Finally</u> I am seriously concerned what we will be left with for hard courts after clay, padel and pickle. Court 7???

- 22. I like the clay courts but find it somewhat frustrating that they are rarely available as always used for club sessions.
- 23. Padel would be amazing for both adults and kids. Two courts would be better!!
- 24. We should absolutely have padel courts I run a whatsapp group that has 40 members who play padel multiple times a week. (but don't play tennis)
- 25. I wholeheartedly support the introduction of padel to the club. As the fastest growing racket sport globally, it has huge potential for the club to increase revenue and get more people playing at the club. Given the lack of local facilities, it would also encourage people to travel to the club from outside Wargrave. I think the hourly rates to play could even be increased slightly more perhaps £30 £40 per hour, given the price of other facilities nearby, making more investment for the club. I think the club could also consider a crowd funding platform to provide investment for further courts. I certainly would put forward investment, and I know a lot of people who would also support it. This could be offset with some 'founding member' benefits. I would love for my children to be able to play padel as well; however at the price of commercial padel courts, this isn't possible. a local court would enable junior members to learn and play, driving further use and benefit of the court(s).

And based on the strong feedback for clay and padel, we will probably run an EGM in January for members to vote on potential plans to introduce a further 2 artificial clay courts (probably on courts 3 and 4) plus plans for a single padel court (probably on court 8). It is assumed that both proposals would not require any further changes in fees for 2025/2026.
